Plenary and Parallel Program

The Track Conveners and the Program Committee worked hard to deal with all 576 abstracts that were submitted, deciding which of them would be the most suitable for the limited number of presentation slots available, and which ones would have to be posters instead. The corresponding acceptance messages were sent on March 15 or up to a few days later. If you did not receive such a message for your abstract yet, please check your spam folder and/or let us know at chep2018-pc@cern.ch and we will follow up. You can also check the status of your contributions directly in Indico.

The International Advisory Committee and the Program Committee are working on a rich plenary program covering a broad range of topics relevant to computing not only in HEP but also in related communities and beyond. This is the first time a new idea for plenary presentations has been tried out: the promotion of selected, suitable presentations out of their parallel sessions. The authors were typically asked to widen the scope of their presentations, in line with the usual expectations for plenary sessions.

There also is good news concerning the posters. First, all of them will be viewable during the whole conference. Second, they will automatically qualify for a competition to be held during the conference: participants will be invited to vote for the best posters and the winners will be announced on the final day of the conference!

PyHEP 2018 Workshop

Please be reminded that the PyHEP 2018 workshop, the first of the new series of workshops "Python in HEP", will be held as a pre-CHEP event in Sofia, Bulgaria, on 7-8 July 2018, the weekend just before the start of CHEP. This 1.5-day pre-CHEP workshop will focus on a review of where and how Python is used in our community, and what the future will hold. It will also be a forum for the participants, representatives of the community, to discuss topics around the areas of work identified in the HSF Community White Paper.

A keynote presentation on <u>JupyterLab</u> will be given by <u>Vidar Tonaas Fauske</u>, a member of the developers team. The <u>agenda</u> will be composed of seven plenary sessions dedicated to the following topics:

- 1. Historical perspective and overview
- 2. PyROOT and Python bindings
- 3. HEP python software ecosystem
- 4. Distribution and installation
- 5. Analysis frameworks
- 6. Python 2 versus 3
- 7. Open discussion on education and training

There will be ample time for discussion.

The workshop will take place in the <u>Hilton Hotel</u>, 5 minutes walk from the CHEP conference venue. The <u>PyHEP 2018 registration form</u> is to be found next to the registration form for CHEP 2018.

Public Outreach Event



A public outreach event will be held on Sunday, July 8, 19:00-22:00, in Presentation hall "V parka" at "Malkoto NDK", which is in the conference venue. The event, called "Universal Science," will feature presentations and a panel discussion on the science and computing of particle physics, and how human diversity helps us to address the challenges. Travel to Bulgaria

Lodging

The closest airport is Sofia International Airport (SOF), which is well-connected to the city center. Read more. Most CHEP participants will not need to rent a car. Sofia is a compact city with a good public transportation system. There are plenty of restaurants within walking distance from the conference venue and the recommended hotels.

We have preliminary booking arrangements for 200 rooms at the Hilton Hotel (100), Grand Hotel Sofia (65) and Central Park Hotel (35). A list of hotels recommended by the organizers can be found here.

Childcare

For the first time CHEP will offer childcare services in the Hilton Hotel in a close proximity to the conference facilities. The service will be offered to all registered attendees and will be adapted to the conference program. It will run from 8:30am to 6pm during the week and will cover the time of the conference dinner if requested.
